LEGAL International Journal on Law Call for Papers

Dear Scholars,

Greetings! **LEGAL** is an international academic journal founded and published by **Taihang Spring Group LLC**, USA. It is currently a quarterly publication (one issue every three months); its website is www.taihangspring.com. **LEGAL** has collaborated with a Chinese interdisciplinary frontier Preprint platform for law and science, ChinaXiv–Law & Science. ChinaXiv is jointly constructed and operated by the National Science Library of the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the academic community; it uses the academic exchange model featuring synergistic development between preprints and journals, aimed at helping preprint authors in law and science achieve global dissemination of their research outputs at the earliest opportunity. This, in turn, enhances the global impact of the journal, establishes a demonstration of a new academic exchange paradigm, and fosters an academic exchange ecosystem that is “open, shared, co-governed, and collaborative.” The Academic Committee and Editorial Board of **LEGAL International Academic Journal** are composed of professors and legal experts from globally renowned law schools.

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Scope and Eligibility of Submissions

Scholars, faculty members and students in the social sciences are all welcome to submit manuscripts. The subject matter of submissions should relate to **law, legal logic, legal technology, legal artificial intelligence, legal professional ethics** or other cognate topics. There is no restriction on authors' academic rank: undergraduate students, master's students, doctoral students and university faculty may all submit their manuscripts.

Information for Authors

1. There is no restriction on submission timing; manuscripts are accepted throughout the year. Review comments will be provided within 15 days after submission. Upon passing review, the paper will be published within three months.
2. The article processing charge (APC) is 500 dollars per paper. The journal can provide either an international invoice or a domestic (Chinese) invoice, both of which are suitable for reimbursement.
3. The journal welcomes authors to introduce other faculty members, lawyers or students to publish their papers in our journal. If you are able to refer multiple individuals, you may have the opportunity to become a member of our Editorial Board or a Managing Editor, enjoying further preferential benefits.

Formatting Requirements and Submission Instructions

1. Authors are required to provide an English version of the manuscript. If an English version is unavailable, authors may initially submit a Chinese manuscript. The word count limit is 5,000–8,000 characters for both languages. After the manuscript passes review, the author may then translate it into English and resubmit. A plagiarism detection report must also be provided, with a similarity rate not exceeding 10%. If translation and polishing services are needed, we charge a fee of 150 dollars per paper. When opting for this translation service, authors may directly submit the Chinese manuscript; subsequent typesetting and proofreading will be handled by the journal office.
2. Submission email address: legal@taihangspring.com. The email subject line should read “Author’s Name + Paper Title.”
3. Please indicate in the email or within the body of the manuscript **the author’s name (including the corresponding author)**, postal address, postal code, **email address**, telephone number and other personal information.
4. For paper formatting, please refer to the attached LEGAL Formatting Requirements.

Frequently Asked Questions & Answers

Q: Can this journal be retrieved?

A: The journal is included in databases such as VIP (Weipu).

Q: What is the journal's review system?

A: Review is conducted by the editorial office and is based on peer review. There is no online submission system; all communications proceed via email.

Q: Are the language requirements very strict?

A: There are no excessively detailed language requirements. However, if a manuscript is obviously machine-translated, the author will be asked to revise it. Review comments and revision suggestions will be provided.

Q: Does the journal provide a printed/ physical copy?

A: By default, we provide only a PDF version of the individual paper and a PDF version of the complete journal. If authors require, we can provide 1–2 printed copies.

Q: How long does the review process take?

A: Our journal conducts a preliminary examination of the manuscript's form, essential elements, academic foundation and other related aspects to decide whether to forward it to the responsible editor and expert reviewers. This stage normally takes approximately 3–5 working days. If, during the editing and review process, the editorial office receives a dispute from a non-author concerning authorship or content, processing of the manuscript will be suspended until the dispute is properly resolved.

Q: How soon after submission can a paper be published?

A: LEGAL is a quarterly journal. If the author cooperates closely, publication can be achieved within **three months**. Provided that the journal's publication schedule is not adversely affected, the author may withdraw the manuscript at any time. After withdrawal, the paid APC will be refunded (if the manuscript has already been submitted to the review body, a review fee of 30 dollars per paper will be deducted).

Q: How many articles are published per issue?

A: Each issue of LEGAL typically includes approximately 5–10 articles.

Q: Can the journal be searched on CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure)?

A: As an international social science journal, LEGAL is currently applying for indexing on CNKI. If CNKI indexing is a requirement for you, please consider submitting to another journal first.

Q: What is the rank or tier of the journal?

A: This depends on the specific policies of your institution. In most universities, the journal is regarded as an ordinary periodical, comparable to domestic general journals. Some institutions may treat it as a special-category publication, and its standing will need to be assessed by the academic committee during professional title evaluation. LEGAL is a cooperating journal of the “ChinaXiv–Law & Science” Preprint Platform of the National Science Library of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Law and Logic Committee of the China Logic Society, and other institutions. It has also established the “Taihang Legal Cup” Doctoral Excellence Award at the School of Law of China University of Political Science and Law. (Faculty members should consult their university’s Office of Research Administration or Human Resources; graduate students should consult their Graduate School.)

Q: Must the English version be submitted?

A: Publication must ultimately be in English. However, a Chinese version may be submitted initially. To accommodate authors’ needs, we provide full-text translation, polishing, and other services. The current fee is 150 dollars per paper. If the manuscript is excessively long or highly complex, the fee may be increased at our discretion.

Q: Can publication add points for scholarship evaluation?

A: Whether publication contributes points for scholarship evaluation is determined by your institution’s implementing measures for graduate scholarship and financial aid systems and the detailed rules for scholarship assessment. Please consult your advisor and the secretary of your college.

Q: Can the paper include a project grant number for project completion?

A: Yes, a project grant number may be included. Project titles should be in English, though Chinese may be used under special circumstances. Papers published in international journals may generally be used for project completion.

Q: Is publication useful for graduate school recommendation or doctoral admission?

A: It is undoubtedly useful. For doctoral admissions under the assessment system, “having published a professional academic paper as the first author in an English-language international journal” has become one of the foreign language proficiency requirements at many universities. For graduate school recommendation, having a paper in an international journal will significantly enhance your competitiveness during both the interview and document submission stages, as it demonstrates your English writing ability—a critical skill at the graduate level.

Q: This international journal paper is merely equivalent to a general journal paper and does not seem very useful. What is the value?

A: First, if you have an English-language paper, listing it in project proposals and during professional title evaluation will certainly give you an edge over having only Chinese-language papers, thereby demonstrating your academic competence. Second, writing an English-language paper enables you to unlock new skills, enhances your academic writing ability, and boosts your confidence. It also lays a foundation for future submissions to higher-tier English-language journals. Third, the domestic academic evaluation system is undergoing reform, and many universities are now implementing a “representative works” system. If your school’s policies change, an English-language paper remains perennially relevant and can be submitted as a representative work to the academic committee for review. I am confident it will bring you significant credit.

Q: Can practising lawyers also publish?

A: Lawyers are welcome to publish papers. For many local bar associations, the publication of a paper in an English-language journal is a bonus factor in the recognition and enrollment of foreign-related lawyers. For lawyer professional title evaluation, publishing in an English-language journal can be submitted as an academic achievement at the intermediate, associate senior, or senior lawyer level.

[Title] Font: Arial Black, size: 22, bold, flush left.

[Author] Font: Times New Roman, size: 12, bold. Format: Given name + Surname.
Please indicate the author's affiliation, email, and other information.

[Affiliation] Font: Times New Roman, size: 12. Format: School, University, City, Country.

[Abstract] The word "Abstract" should be in Times New Roman, size: 12, bold, flush left. The content of the abstract is separated by semicolons and should not be bold.

[Keywords] The word "Keywords" should use the same font and size as "Abstract." The content should not be bold.

[Main Body]

Primary Heading (1.): Font: Arial, size: 14, bold.

Secondary Heading (1.1): Font: Arial, size: 12, bold.

Tertiary Heading (1.1.1): Font: Arial, size: 12, italic.

Body text: Font: Times New Roman, size: 12.

All text should be left-aligned. Leave one blank line between paragraphs.

The main body should generally include the following sections: Introduction; Research Focus; Literature Review; Methods; Results; Discussion; Conclusion; Acknowledgements. These may be adjusted according to the content of the paper.

[Funding] Font: Times New Roman, size: 12.

[Notes] Font: Times New Roman, size: 9.

The reference format should follow APA style guidelines.
